

Brynnau Primary School Dosbarth Enfys Reception Class Newsletter Autumn Term 2024

Our topic this term is 'Will you tell me a Story?'

Welcome to the magical world of stories! Is the Gruffalo really so scary? How many bowls of porridge can Goldilocks eat? Can we run faster than a Gingerbread Man? This term we will be finding out about our favourite stories and discovering some new stories too. We will be dressing up to make the story characters come to life, playing imaginatively and enjoying some exciting adventures with our favourite characters! We will read lots of stories and look at the ingredients that go into a fantastic story and we will be brave explorers and as we go on a hunt for the missing items from our favourite stories too to make sure that everyone lives 'Happily Ever After!'. We will also have lots of fun creating our own stories to share with our families and friends, and we'll create our own story maps to retell familiar tales too. We will also plan and participate in a fairy tale tea party, dressing up as our favourite characters for the occasion and create and perform our own 'Once Upon a Time' story show to which everyone will be invited! We are sure that the children are going to have lots of fun this term exploring stories. We aim to explore a different idea, concept or question chosen by the children every week and cover a wide range of fun, engaging play-based learning with the children. There certainly are lots of adventures ahead and it is going to be a VERY busy term! The children will continue to have daily access to the outside environment, including the woods so warm clothes will be appreciated as the weather becomes a little colder but fingers crossed for a pleasantly warm and dry Autumn! We would love to hear about the wonderful things which are linked to the topic that you and your child are learning about at home so please do not hesitate to send it with your child or share it on our class Teams page.

Language, Literacy and Communication

When your child recognises each of the initial sounds they will be given units of CVC words to bring home. Please encourage and support your child to break each word down into sounds to read the word. We will also practise these words in school and new units of words will be sent home when required. When your child is confident segmenting and blending sounds they will receive high frequency words (Tricky words) to work on at home (try a few each week) and a reading book which will be sent home on a Friday. Please can all reading folders, including CVC words be returned on a Monday if possible-Thank you! Enjoy sharing and talking about the book with your child and don't forget to read those all-important bedtime stories too! Once again if your child is unsure of a word encourage them to break it down into sounds whenever possible. It is important that they can read and remember the words.

Some suggestions as to how you can help with the words are as follows: - Playing I Spy or matching games by writing pairs of words onto paper, memory games using post-it notes to cover words, guessing what is covered/ missing etc. Oxford Owl is a great website to practise reading skills and familiarise your child with the Oxford Reading Tree books and characters.

Some useful apps are as follows:

Hairy Letters and Hairy Phonics-Games to reinforce learning and build letters into simple words, the Hairy characters and memorable animations make this a fun and engaging introduction to literacy.

We will continue to answer the register in Welsh, count objects up to 10 and name colours. We will introduce Welsh emotions vocabulary through songs and games. We will continue to learn basic commands and greetings and simple phrases. As part of our triple literacy approach the children will also be developing their Spanish skills. This term we will be learning simple greetings and songs.

Mathematics and Numeracy

Throughout the term the children will learn to count up to 20 fluently and count all the way back to zero! We will begin to learn addition facts to 6 and above and count on with confidence! Encouraging your child to solve simple sums mentally using addition through fun games would be very beneficial. Playing board games such as Bingo and Snakes also helps them to name and order numbers to 20. Using dice also helps with addition and counting skills. We will also be practising holding our pencils correctly and writing our numbers from memory. Our daily 20-minute CLIC sessions will be as follows:

Counting: Children learn to count forwards and backwards and to 'count on and back' from any number.

Learn Its: Recalling basic number facts (addition)

It's Nothing New: Children apply what they have learned to acquire new skills in a simple manner.

Calculation: Children use and apply facts and knowledge from CLIC.

Other information

Please could children also bring in a pair of wellies **clearly labelled with their name** to be stored in our welly shed for our woodland adventures. Apologies now but there may be many occasions when your child returns home a little muddy, but I promise you they will have had lots of fun!

Wellbeing

We will be discussing the importance of being kind to one another and different feelings and emotions. We will talk about the things that we like to do, and what makes us happy. We will discuss how it is important to have a healthy body and mind. We will encourage sharing, turn taking, helping each other and using kind words.

PΕ

We will be developing our physical skills and coordination through movement games, gymnastic sessions, outdoor learning and Forest School sessions too. Reception children **WILL NOT** need a P.E kit this term as we will be continuing to take off our shoes and socks for our P.E sessions. Our P.E sessions are daily. Please remember that children are only allowed to wear small stud earnings and a watch and that all other items of jewellery are not allowed to be worn in school.

Labels

Please can all items of clothing be clearly labelled with your child's name-Especially shoes!

Fruit Snack

A **small fruit** snack is required each day-Please place all fruit snacks in a pot or plastic bag clearly labelled with your child's name.

Dinner Money

All Reception children are entitled to a free school dinner under the rollout of Universal Primary Free School Meals (UPFSM) across Wales

What can you do to help at home?

- Ask and answer questions, share stories of your daily experiences and ask your child to do the same. Encourage your child to learn new vocabulary and phrases. Take a walk outdoors. Talk about the things you see and hear.
- Provide opportunities for "Story time". Talk about the pictures in a book, ask and answer questions about what
 they have heard. Encourage your child to retell or join in with a favourite story. If words or letter sounds are
 mispronounced, model with correct spoken language. Practise sounds every day.
- Encourage a correct and comfortable pencil grip using index fingers and thumbs our pinchy crocodile. Show
 your child how you write in different ways a message board, a puzzle, a shopping list or a party invitation.
 Practise writing your name and numbers daily. Ensure that wide lines are being used to sit all the letters on.
- Encourage your child to count/recite numbers daily in the correct order. You can count the stairs you climb, cars in your toy box, tins in the cupboard etc. Listen to and join in with number rhymes. Many of these can be found on Youtube.
- Begin to learn to recognise and name numbers to at least 20.
- Practise the 'Learn Its' each week.
