Topic - The title of our topic this term is 'Does It Really Matter?'

Within topic lessons, pupils experience rich teaching and learning that incorporates all the Areas of Learning and Experiences (AOLE's) from the Curriculum for Wales (CFW). Below are some of the different avenues our topic title will take us down, some are based on the pupil voice survey conducted in class. It is vital that pupils take ownership of their own learning.

- Environmental disasters.
- Lifestyle choices and global impact.
- How can we support others around the world?
- VE Day and World War II celebrations.
- Reduce, Re-use and Recycle.
- Recipes adaptation and substitution.
- Food groups and nutrition.

Language, Literacy and Communication

This term we will focus on:

- Biography of chefs and scientists.
- Review a cooking show.
- Create a promo script/sketch.
- Chronological report of environmental disaster.
- Autobiography about ourselves.

We will be focussing on these genres of writing, we will follow a structured writing journey to introduce the genre, analyse the features of examples of writing, teach the skills needed, plan a write and finally write for a purpose. The children will have opportunity to develop their skills through direct teaching, research and independent challenges.

Mathematics and Numeracy

This term we will focus on:

- Time and timetables.
- Capacity, length and mass.
- Data and graphs.
- Temperatures and negative numbers.
- Real life context problem solving.
- Estimating.
- Profit and loss.
- Conversion of measurements.

<u>PE -</u>

P.E. will take place on the following days:

Aur, Arian and Efydd will be having Swimming lessons on a Thursday. Please can children bring the appropriate swimming kit in a bag with a towel and goggles.

We will also be having Athletics sessions in preparation for Sports Day. A message for these PE lessons will be sent out via Teachers2Parents.

Please can children wear P.E kit to school with trainers. P.E kit consists of dark joggers/leggings/shorts, white school polo and school jumper/cardigan.

Belongings -

All belongings need to be labelled with children's names. If an item is misplaced it can easily be returned if labelled. This includes drink containers (which need to be brought to school every day), clothing and sandwich boxes. Children are provided with pens, pencils, rulers etc. so there is no need to bring in a pencil case. **Due to limited space children are asked not to bring large bags or rucksacks to school, just a book bag.** If you do not have one, these can be purchased from the school office.

Fruit Snack and Packed Lunches –

Please provide your child with a healthy fruit snack every day. This can be eaten during first break. Nuts are not allowed as we are a nut free school due to allergies.

Homework-

Spelling words will be sent via Teacher to Parents, these will be posted weekly. Pupils will need to spell these words correctly as well as understand them, use them in sentences and spell them consistently in their daily work. Children will be given a 'Learn It's' timed test on a Friday. They will also complete CLIC and SAFE Maths tests. Please help your child to learn their times tables and' Learn It' facts as this will help them in many areas of their Maths work. This term the children will be given Big Maths homework sheets on a Monday, to be returned to school the following Monday. These sheets are specific to your child's Maths targets and will help them achieve their target and move their learning on. Children will bring their reading books home every day in their book bags and will be expected to bring them in to school every day. Try to read regularly with your child, asking questions about what they have read and encourage them to read accurately, with good expression. Please sign the Reading Record with the page read up to and a comment if you so wish. Additional homework may be provided to enhance the learning within our termly topic.
